Car Parking

Thank you for supporting the changes we have made this week to our drop off and pick up times. It has helped to reduce the risk of the children getting hurt not only at the beginning and end of the day but also as we walk to and from the village hall, especially after worship. We are working on plans to get the pathway compressed to help with prams and pushchairs.



Couple of reminders:

- 1. All children must use the back gate to enter and leave the school grounds. The gates are open between 8:45 9:00am and then again at 3:05 3:20pm.
- 2. The front gate can only be used by the children who live in the village and walk to school and when the person driving has a blue badge. Mrs Marsden needs to see all blue badges. These families need to press the buzzer when they arrive, and Mrs Marsden will let you in. There may be times when she is on the phone or delivering a message, please wait patiently and she will let you in as soon as possible.
- 3. If you park on the road, please ensure that you don't park opposite the school gates so families crossing have a clear view of traffic so they can cross over safely.

PE Kits - After Easter

After Easter, we will no longer be asking the children to come dressed in the PE kits on a Tuesday and Friday. This was one of our COVID measures which we no longer need to continue.

After Easter, the children will need to bring their PE kits in a red draw string bag (no rucksacks please as we simply don't have enough space). Kits need to be brought in each Monday, and they will come home again on a Friday for washing.



The children need to come to school in their full school uniforms each morning from Easter onwards.

PE Kit

We have made the decision to change the colour of our PE top from white to red. The white tops haven't been ideal for PE as they become discoloured quickly.



We are currently talking to Badged to discuss the different options but wanted you to be aware of the change, just in case you were thinking of buying a new PE shirt soon. We are looking to replace the current top with one that dries quickly and doesn't cost any more than our current top, but also looks smart.

We will not be expecting everyone to buy a new shirt immediately – instead we would like you to purchase one of the new tops the next time your child's needs replacing over the next year.

The red PE tops will become compulsory from September 2024.

Recently, we have sent out information about the residentials next year. There are also a few trips planned before the end of this academic year. We know that lots of our families are finding things financially challenging at the moment.
