Earlier this week, I had the pleasure to accompany Hedgehogs on their residential. They will be working with Squirrels and Badgers over the next half delivering some football focused lessons in the morning followed by some literacy interventions in the afternoons. It was particularly lovely to welcome Ryan as he is a former pupil of Warmingham.

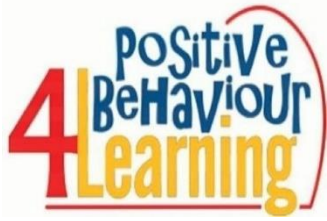

## **PTA News**

Over the last year, our PTA had raised an incredible £5260.48 which has been used to fund the coaches for both residential (saving families just over £74 pounds), the wow starters which the children adore, ten laptops which are used every day in school to enhance the children's learning, the Y6's prom and leavers trip, Christmas presents for the children (books) and Christmas crackers.

As you'll already be aware, Claire Henry has stepped down as chair. Unfortunately, no one has stepped forward to take over the role so we are now in a position where the PTA may have to fold. This will have huge impact on the children in school – they adore the events and benefit directly from the funds raised which are used to enhance the children's learning experiences.

The PTA committee has to consist of a chair, treasurer and secretary to meet the requirements set out in the constitution. As parents and staff, we are all members of the PTA. Moving forward to reduce the workload of the PTA committee and make the role of chair more manageable they would like to have one class representative per year group. They would be responsible for organising one or two events a year with the other parents of the children in that year group, distributing the workload out more fairly so every parent helps in some way at least once a year. The PTA committee would then oversee these events, providing advice as needed. I will be sending out a questionnaire on Monday with more information about what each role would involve, in the hope that we have enough volunteers to ensure that our PTA can continue to run. It would be such a shame for the children if it has to fold.

## **Relationships & Sex Education**

Relationships and Sex (RSE) are part of our Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE). Our RSHE curriculum develops the knowledge, understanding and skills young people need to manage their lives, now and in the future. Learning about relationships and sex supports children to stay safe, enjoy positive relationships of all kinds, and make informed decisions. It will build positive foundations for healthy and safe relationships of all kinds.

At Warmingham, our curriculum starts with our family and friends and how to be kind, the importance of caring and respectful relationships before moving onto how our bodies change during puberty in preparation for reproduction and the basic facts about pregnancy in Year 6. As part of the curriculum, we also cover online relationships because of the world we live in today. We use the 'Christopher Winters Project' to deliver our Relationships & Sex Education during the summer of each year.



A copy of our RSHE scheme of work, Relationships Policy and the units of work from the Christopher Winters Project can be found on the school's website. We will be delivering our RSE the week after next. This will be happening every Tuesday afternoon for a period of three weeks. If you have any concerns or would like some additional information, please either speak to your child's class teacher.

This year we will be holding our Sports' Day on **Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July**. The children will be taking part in events throughout the day.



The morning will involve lots of activities where the children will compete against their classmates in other houses.
