

#### **Message from Reverend Paul**

During our recent family holiday, we managed to complete a challenge that we have been working on for many years.

For over a decade we have been walking the Wainwright fells in the Lake District. Alfred Wainwright wrote a series of seven pictorial guides to the Lakeland fells which cover 214 peaks. Completing the Wainwrights – walking to the top of each of the fells has become a walking challenge. One that we as a family accidently fell into, then decided to take on, and completed on the top of Wetherlam in May.

Walking in the Lake District is an absolute joy. During the many visits to the fells, I have been afforded lots of time to reflect. The amazing thing about The Wainwrights is that they each have an amazing view. Views that to me speak of the wonder of God. The words of Paul in Romans certainly ring true for me, Ever since the creation of the world God's eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been seen and understood through the things God has made. Gazing for miles over these amazing hills has helped me to see the beauty and wonder of God. We have walked in all weathers, from blazing sunshine to wind, rain, hail, and even snow. Some days you could see from one end of the Lake District to the other and the view would take your breath away. On other days you could barely see more than 20m ahead. Yet even on these days we were still gifted amazing moments where creation showed us God. A break in the clouds providing a beautiful ray of light, a stream we may otherwise have missed, a bright shining rainbow.

Walking in the hills is, you might say, a picture of life; it is not always easy, some of the paths are steep, some slippery, there is a lot of uphill and sometimes you think you might be lost. Yet even on the steepest slopes, even when the weather was bad, we could look around, we could stare in awe at the views and be reminded of God's eternal power and divine nature.

On many occasions I would find myself singing, When through the woods, and forest glades I wander, And hear the birds sing sweetly in the trees. When I look down, from lofty mountain grandeur And see the brook, and feel the gentle breeze. Then sings my soul, my Saviour God, to Thee, How great Thou art, how great Thou art.

It was a joy to walk these hills with my family. We have been taken to the most spectacular of places with the most wonderful scenery. We have been reminded that nature can remind us of God's magnificence. If you are feeling life is uphill, maybe you can look to one of God's most precious gifts, His beautiful creation, and allow that to remind you of his love.


