Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths Family Learning Event – Wednesday 27th March

We are hosting, the first of its kind, STEM Family Learning event on 27th March 2024 from 2.30pm until 4.00pm, at the Warmingham Village Hall. There will be a selection of stalls and workshops for the children and their parents to enjoy together. All activities will be related to STEM, with companies and other educational establishments showcasing a variety of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. The children will have the opportunity to visit the event from 1.30pm with their class and then parents are invited to come along and enjoy the rest of the afternoon with their children from 2.30pm. There will be lots to see and do including Biology, Chemistry, Robotics, 'Maths is Fun', Bentley, Chess and Virtual Reality.

Concert – Saturday 15th June @ 7pm St Leonard's Church

The children at Warmingham School have been invited to join an exciting singing event on Saturday 15th June at 7pm. Phoenix Voices, the adult choir which Mrs Henry leads are coming to Warmingham Church to perform in a concert. We would love the children to take part too. Places are available for all members of the choir and there will also be availability for the children in Key Stage 2. This will be a fantastic opportunity for the children to work alongside some great singers and develop their performance skills. A professional accompanist will also work alongside the children. We will be singing songs such as 'The Wellerman' and 'This is Me' from The Greatest Showman. The school Choir will also be singing songs from 'Matilda' and 'Les Miserables'.

There is no cost for the children to be involved, however children will need to be supervised at the event and tickets for parents and carers will be available at a reduced rate of £10.00 per family through school. All proceeds are going towards the renovation of the church tower.
