Messy Church

This year's theme for our messy church was Christmas around the world. Each class took an element of Christmas from a country for their activities. Otters Class looked at the 'Stella di natale – Christmas star' in Italy. Hedgehogs created their own baubles based on the traditional hand-painted glass baubles from Italy.
