


Please ensure the following:

Each year we ask the children in Otters and Hedgehogs to make a Easter Bonnet to wear to our Easter Service.






Quiz Night

I think the school is doing the following well:

Parent 1

Friendly approachable staff, ensuring the children thrive in all aspects

Parent 2

Supporting my child in developing her literacy and numeracy skills.

Nurturing the emotional and social development of my child.

Fostering a sense of community between the school, the parents and the local area.

Extra-curricular activities e.g. trips, events, visitors to the school.

Parent 3

Caring for children, helping them do their best, certificates, creative and interesting education.

Parent 4

Communication with parents. Really like picture updates on Facebook.

Opportunities to come into school to see and celebrate children's work.

Frequent text message updates, informative newsletter etc. Knowledgeable, experienced and nurturing staff. Staff pick up on extra support or interventions needed for children to support their academic and social development.

Very impressed with SEN support and can see the reduction in my child's anxiety due to the small and nurturing environment of Warmingham.

Variety of clubs offered for enrichment. Particular favourites in our house have been cooking and sport with Mr Barton. The opportunity for trips to enhance learning and overnight stays for confidence building.

Parent 5

School Club provision and choice Opportunities for school trips and experiences such as Sale Sharks rugby coaching at PE Supportive teaching and time spent with children when they don't understand something Parents evenings and reports so know where child is at progress wise Better communication over the last 2 years also School lunch provisions.

Parent 6

Good to see EXS (expected) and GDS (greater depth) pupils are being challenged.

Parent 7

Safeguarding, kindness and caring, high quality of education, my child is safe happy and learning.

Parent 8

There seems to be a really nice mix of topics in the school, a good balance between academics and other topics such as wellbeing/mindfulness, PE, play, outdoor learning etc

We've found the homework challenges interesting and not too much to complete.

*** always talks highly of all the staff and everyone seems really caring towards the pupils. It also seems really nice that the children have friendships across the school years.

The school would be even better if ...

Parent 1

I am very happy with the school, my child loves coming to school and has made huge progress since September. The only really small improvement would be to have more notice in communications involving things like non-uniform days.

We will try to give at least two weeks' notice of events or changes in timetables.

Parent 2

Parent 3

A way was found for everyone to enjoy PE (especially team sports), not just those who play a lot outside of school.

We currently ask which children would like to participate in a sporting competition. Names are then put in hat and the required number are pulled out. The children who aren't chosen are always given first refusal for the next sporting event. I will speak to Mr Barton and Mr Friel to see what else we can do to ensure all of our pupils enjoy PE so they are keen to participate in sporting events. Mr Friel is currently planning some sporting competition across the trust for the summer term.

Parent 4

There was some kind of outdoor Welly Storage so children can access during break and lunch time in wet months.

Additional opportunities for Forest School and outdoor learning.

I will speak to the PTA to see if they would be willing to purchase a welly store for us. We are hoping that within the next year or two that one of our members of staff will become Forest School trained to enhance the children's learning experience.

Parent 5

Formal generic school sports shirts and shorts - one set in school with different sizes that teams could use if playing against other schools - was quite poor when we went to the football tournament and were the only school in normal PE kit. Children felt bad about that and it affected their performance.

I have put a check list together for sporting events. This list includes ensuring that the children participating have the opportunity to practise as a team before the event and to also ensure that they are provided with one of our kits.

More attention paid to how pupils treat each other at break and lunchtime. I have had a few incidents over the last 2 years where my child has wanted to change schools because children in their class were being mean to them – calling them 'fat', telling them to 'go and kill themselves' and getting other children to ignore them so they have to sit on their own at break time and play with the cat. I have raised some of these incidents but not all as my child was worried that they would be treated even worse by the other children if I got involved. The school classes are so small that children can't have alternative friends to play with when there is an argument or any form of exclusion so extra care should be taken to actively listen out for things like this and nip them in the bud and also notice when children are on their own on the playground and encourage people to include them in something.

Thank you for sharing this with us. We will do some additional work with the class involved. Every member of staff will also monitor the situation closely to ensure that we can nip them in the bud and actively encourage the children to include everyone.

Parent 6

Sporting opportunities were extended to more activities and time was given to practise for events. Sporting kit was provided for events to ensure that the children look like a team. Opportunities to develop cultural capital.

ALL children were recognised the same with their achievements rather that the SEN or 'you've been well behaved this week'.

We are widening the children's experiences by providing rich and engaging learning opportunities as we develop our curriculum.

We aim to ensure that we celebrate all of the children's achievements throughout the year. In addition to the things we already do, I am introducing a 'letter of praise' for all of the children who always try their very best and follow our rules schools every day. Class teachers will nominate children, and we will discuss these as a staff before sending the letters home.

Parent 7

Some changes are made last minute, and this is difficult when kids live in 2 parent families so might not have different changes of clothes available at last minute etc. this is only minor and I'm happy with all other aspects of school.

Parent 8

I do find the methods of communication difficult to follow - some information is given in an email, the newsletter, school spider, eduspot, tapestry and occasionally we haven't been sent some notices that have gone to other parents or we've got information that other parents have not. It would just be a bit more helpful for busy parents for there to be one method of communication between parents and the school - I worry about missing information/updates.

I appreciate that having a number of different platforms for communication isn't ideal. Unfortunately, there isn't one platform which meets all of our needs. We also try to send a text message if we have just sent out an important message. Mrs Marsden is going to put together a separate leaflet for all new parents explaining the why we use each platform and how they can be assessed. I will ask our ICT technician to check each platform to find out why some parents aren't receiving some of our messages. This seems to be a particular problem with the 'teacher to parents' platform.
