

## Why am I running around so much?

Have you every stopped to ask yourself, "Why am I running around so much?" A brief glance at the diary will tell you that December is flat out. In fact, it seems that the run for the line at Christmas starts way back in November. And what a race it is! You certainly need some endurance to get through all the shopping, the Christmas card writing, the parties, school events, mince pies - both baking and eating, never mind effort you need to do your job as well.



And then there is putting up the decorations, they make the steeple chase barriers look like toy hurdles.

Somehow, rather than a time of preparation to remember the birth of the Prince of Peace, December has become a marathon run at a sprint pace. It is no wonder so many people are utterly exhausted when Christmas comes around. They just don't want to run anymore.

And yet Jesus, whose birth we remember, is one that we certainly want to run towards.

The shepherds are a great example to us of importance of the birth of Jesus. The message translation records what happened to the shepherds after the angels left them,

The shepherds talked it over. "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." They left, running, and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. Seeing was believing. Luke 2:15-17 MSG

You have got to love the shepherds. They hear about the good news of Jesus and at once drop everything and race to find him. They left running. In doing so they got to look into the eyes of the Son of God lying in the manger. They ran to the saviour of the world; they ran to meet 'Immanuel - 'God with us'. In all our running about in various directions this Christmas, let us make time to run towards Jesus, whether that is in a service, in prayer or in a moment of reflection. Let us run towards the manger and as the shepherds did, let us also stop, pause for breath, and gaze in wonder at 'God with us' - even us! Perhaps then, focussed on Jesus, we might ask ourselves, "Why am I running around so much?"

#### **Remembrance Concert**

On Remembrance Sunday, Rob Fitzsimons, one of the trumpeters from the Band played the Last Post and Reveille at the service at the War Memorial in the village.




#### Treasurer for St Peter's


