Attendance

We understand that there may be occasions when your child is unable to attend school due to illness or other unavoidable circumstances. However, it is important to remember that chronic absenteeism can significantly impact your child's learning experience.

As a school, we monitor school attendance, tracking any pupil whose overall attendance falls below 95% (this doesn't include any authorised absences).

Children should only stay at home if they are really poorly with a high temperature, sickness and/or diarrhoea. If you are in any doubt, please send you child into school. We will keep a close eye on them and if need be, we will send them home.











This year we are working towards becoming a silver rights respecting school. Educating for courageous advocacy must embody an ethos of action-taking, challenging injustice and becoming agents of change in the transformation of ourselves, our relationships and our communities from the local level to the global. We at Warmingham endeavour to nurture and grow courageous advocates.
