Times Tables

Have you ever thought back on your primary school years and wished you'd paid more attention to learning your times tables? Knowing your times tables is such as important aspect of the maths curriculum in KS2. By the end of Year 4, all of the children should know their timetables (up to the twelves).

This week in school, we have introduced 'Times Tables Champions' to build up the children's rapid recall of multiplication facts. Each Friday, the children will be tested on their tables and rewarded with a certificate when they can answer so many questions correctly within a given time frame.

How can you help my child at home?

- 1. Ensure your child to play on TT Rockstars at least five times a week little and often works best!
- 2. Download the 'Times table Champion' sheets from http://www.timestables.me.uk/printable-pdf-quiz-generator.htm for some additional practice.



Help us win England Rocks!

We will be taking part in a friendly competition involving schools from England from Monday 8th November to Thursday 11th November. It's all done online via play.ttrockstars.com. For every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, your child will earn their class a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a daily 60-minute limit (see below). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

All game modes (Gig, Garage, Studio, etc.) will count but only from games played between 7:30AM GMT and 7:30PM GMT on Monday 8th, Tuesday 9th, Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th. To support player wellbeing, there is a daily time limit of 60 minutes per player. In other words, each player can earn competition points for up to 60 minutes between 7.30am and 7.30pm. Once the player goes beyond 60 minutes of play on a given day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans. We suggest a limit of half an hour a day outside school hours – some will play more, some will play less.



Playtime Snacks

As part of our morning routine, children can have a snack a playtime to keep the hunger pangs away and keep up their energy levels until lunchtime. It's important that the snacks don't contain too much sugar to avoid highs and lows throughout the school day. After half term, the class teachers will be promoting healthy snacks with the children.

- Fruit
- Vegetables sticks with hummus or cream cheese
- **Bread sticks**
- Cheese such as Baby-bel or cheddar chunks
- Low sugar cereal bars
- Low sugar flapjacks
- Raisins
- Crackers
- Rice cakes
- Small party sized bag of biscuits (less than 100 calories)

Please do not send the children in with the following snacks:

- Nuts (allergies)
- Chocolate bars
- High sugar biscuits (more than 100 calories)
- Crisps
