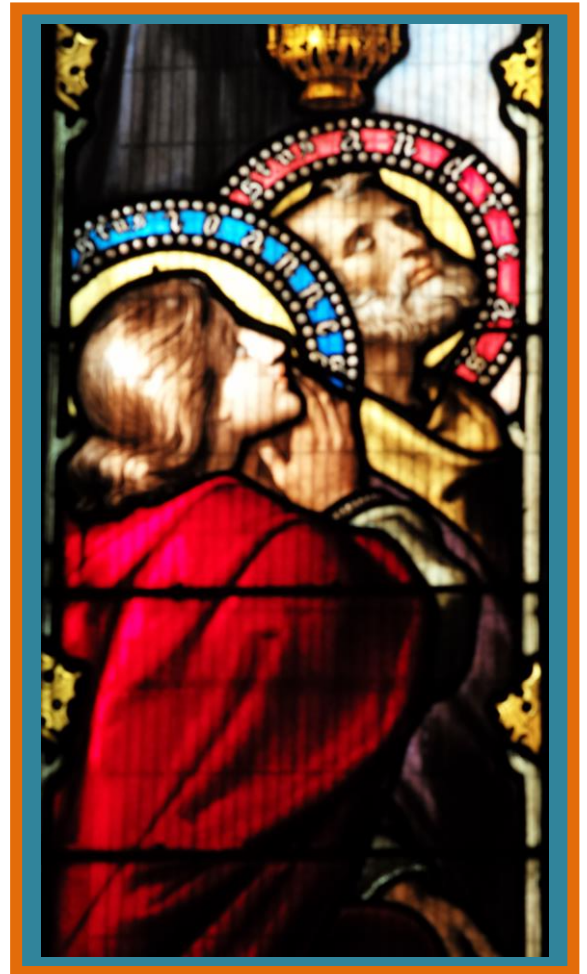

Jesus has washed their feet, told them that Judas would betray him and Peter would deny knowing him and then he comforts them. Jesus told his disciples

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.
John 14:27



In our world of turmoil, in all the confusing noise and blustering messages these words can give us great hope. The peace Jesus is offering his disciples is not the absence of noise, the next few days were going to be full of it. He was certainly not offering them a life free from trouble or conflict. Within hours he was arrested, beaten and crucified. The peace Jesus was offering was not as the world gives, it was different from the fragile peace that the news outlets keep telling us about. The peace that Jesus offers is different, it is about presence. When Jesus offers peace, He is offering the presence of God with the disciples. The presence of God with us.

After Jesus resurrection he met his disciples again, On one occasion,

Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. John 20:26-27

Easter reminds us that peace can be found in the presence of God with us, walking alongside us in all the noise and conflict we face. This Easter may you know true peace. The peace that Jesus gives.

As some of you may know, we have spent many holidays in Cornwall. Now the children are grown up we are lucky not to have to visit during the summer school holidays. We prefer to go in March, to witness the Spring in all its glory and late September when things have calmed down but the sea is still warm and the beginnings of Autumn are just starting to show.

Whilst on holiday we use the same beautiful cottage and attend St Levan Church. This is the first or last church in England depending how you look at it. Nestled in a dip at the top of the cliffs about a ten minute walk from the Minack

Theatre. It is well worth a visit if you are ever in the region. It is always open, rain or shine and is a welcome stop for those walking the coastal path. There are free drinks and energy bars available, bowls and towels to soak aching feet and if a church member is there, a very warm welcome.

It's this welcome that has kept us coming back all this time. This March holiday we were not only made welcome on the Sunday but we were invited to join the Induction Service for the new vicar, Rev Adam Thomas. This took place on Thursday 13th March at St Buryan Church.

Rev Adam will have his work cut out serving the Lands End Benefice of St Levan, St Sennen and St Buryan churches as vicar and also associate curate of Paul (St Pol-de-Léon) church. They are all very different in style of worship.

St Buryan Church was full to capacity with congregation and clergy coming from far and wide. Adam chose the hymns: Will you come and follow me; Brother, Sister let me serve you; Guide me O though Great Redeemer.

He is a proud Welshman with a good singing voice. So appreciated the efforts of the local male voice choir.

The acting Bishop of Truro gave the sermon focusing on music and song, in particular God's Song of Love and the need for harmony. A subliminal message, maybe??

He did make everyone laugh saying he himself could not play an instrument and his singing voice left a lot to be desired.

At the conclusion of the service Rev Adam rang the church bell to signal the beginning of his ministry in the Lands End Benefice.

A good spread followed which the Cornish do very well, alongside traditional pasties and scones with jam and cream (jam first of course) they had made a huge number of Welsh Cakes to make him feel at home. We went home with a picnic for the next day, there was so much food.

These will be interesting times as the churches have had a relatively free hand in running things and devising services during the four years of the interregnum.

I'm sure they will all learn from each other and it will be interesting for us in September to see how things are developing.

Adam has already invited everyone to an evening in the refurbished Rectory. They will watch the film - The Way, starring Michael Sheen as a bereaved father who decides to walk the Compostela Santiago. It will be followed by refreshments and discussion.

The Easter Sunrise service will take place on Sennen Beach followed by breakfast in The Old Success pub. We are quite sad to be missing these events. I'm hoping our September break will coincide with Harvest and we will be able to attend the feast which is always held in The Logan Rock pub. There appears to be a theme developing here.

Anyway it was lovely to experience a beautifully warm welcome in our other church and I'm already counting the weeks until we can return to our own little bit of Heaven on Earth.

Walk 'n Talk

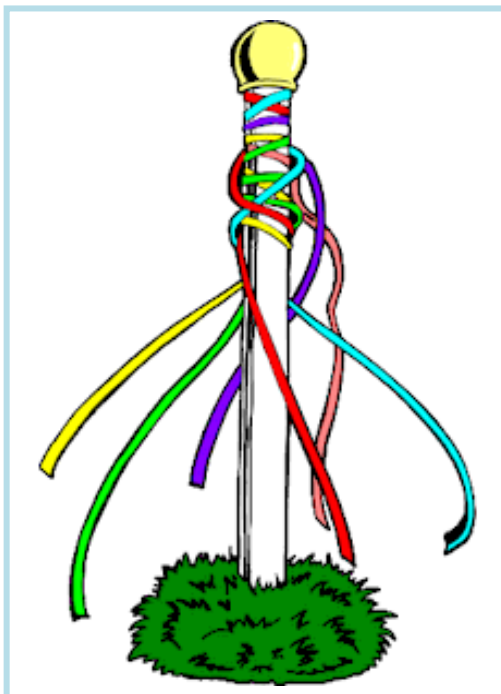
The March walk was from Marbury Park, Northwich and along a stretch of the Trent and Mersey Canal followed by lunch at the Stanley Arms.
