It was wonderful to welcome our children back after the half-term break - our school is a hive of activity!

Punctuality Matters!

Our Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) is an integral component of our broader Relationships, Sex, and Health Education (RSHE) curriculum. This program is designed to empower young people with the essential knowledge, understanding, and skills they need to navigate today's complex world and plan confidently for their future. By exploring topics of relationships and sex, our children learn not only how to stay safe but also how to enjoy positive and respectful relationships, ultimately building a firm foundation for healthy, lifelong connections.

At Warmingham, we begin our curriculum by focusing on the basics - our families, friendships, and the importance of kindness, caring, and respectful interaction. As the children progress, the curriculum evolves to cover key topics such as the physical and emotional changes experienced during puberty, preparation for reproduction, and vital pregnancy facts in Year 6. Recognising the digital age we live in, we also address online relationships, ensuring our students receive well-rounded guidance applicable to both the real and virtual worlds.



To deliver this crucial learning, we employ the 'Christopher Winters Project' each summer, which enriches our RSE program with dynamic, interactive lessons. For your convenience, a copy of our RSHE scheme of work, our Relationships Policy, and the relevant units from the Christopher Winters Project are available on the school website. We will be rolling out our RSE curriculum the week after next.
