

News from Each Class



Otters – Mrs Allen

This term has been so busy and I am so pleased with all of Otters, they have achieved their first full term in school. We started our first topic back in September with timelines, we looked at our own timelines and how we have changed from being a baby. We created our own family trees and explored how families can be different. We looked at the significant people in our lives such as our friends, immediate family members and our extended families.

Our most recent topic has been celebrations, we have looked at a wide variety of celebrations from bonfire night, birthdays, religious celebrations and most recently Christmas and our celebration of our wonderful Nativity production.

Next term, we will take a STEM theme as we become designers. We will be putting our design technology skills to the test making a range of interesting things from buildings to vehicles. We have a very exciting start to the new term that will be revealed in due course.

Hedgehogs – Mrs B

We began our study theme by investigating a 'time capsule' that was found in the school grounds. We looked at objects from the past and thought about the differences between now and then. This created many questions.

As Historians, we then travelled back in time to meet a Victorian lady and discovered what life was really like! The teachers were very different to ours. They made you stand when they entered the room, made you wear a dunce's hat if you gave the wrong answer, even gave you the cane!

As Design Technologists we created healthy fruit kebabs (linked to our Science unit) and planned, made and evaluated our own Victorian toy – a cup and ball.

As Artists we were inspired by Giuseppe Arcimboldo, creating our own self-portraits with fruit. We even created a 3D portrait of Jesus!

During the second half of this term, we learnt about the lives of significant individuals such as Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole and how they helped us to have better lives. This gave us the knowledge to write our own fact files.

Combining our other curriculum subjects and inspired by Robert Fitzroy who published the first ever daily weather forecast, in The Times on August 1st, 1861, as Geographers, we created our own weather station so that we could record our own weather. We concluded that it has been a very cold and windy term!

For our 'Fantastic Finish', we created our very own Museum followed by a Victorian afternoon tea amongst our homemade Victorian Christmas decorations. We have most definitely enjoyed our learning of the Victorians. In true Victorian style, we say, "Hallelujah!"

We look forward to next Term when our Study Theme will be a STEM based enquiry:

What is an invention?

Can I invent and create something new?

Using the umbrella text

We will research inventions of the past and then we will become the inventors of the future. Watch this space...

Squirrels – Miss Turrell

We have had a brilliant Autumn term in Squirrels. It all began in September when we were archaeologists for the day, discovering artefacts in the school playground. These artefacts took us back to Ancient Roman times. We learnt all about the Roman Empire, the strength and force of the Roman army, explored historic art where we made our own mosaics and designed and made our own pizzas! Our topic ended brilliantly with our trip to Chester. The children have had a fantastic time learning all about life in Ancient Rome and their interest and enthusiasm has amazed me!

Next term the children will become inventors! We have a very exciting start to the term which will definitely intrigue the children and bring out their design skills and creativity.

Badgers – Miss Rauer

This term, Badgers Class have been exploring our local history and have created some wonderful work that reflects what Warrington would have been like through different historical periods. We had a storyteller share the tale of the Moston Dragon and wrote our own local folktales. We learnt about why the Romans valued salt so much and how it would have been extracted from the flashes in Warrington through a workshop with Middlewich Heritage. We re-created photographs of the school from the 1990s, and we studied the canals in Middlewich.

In the Spring term, our focus will be design technology and we will be studying electrical mechanisms, famous inventors and materials. Badgers Class will be challenging themselves to create the best invention that they can, using mechanisms like motors, lights and remote controls. More will be revealed in January!



COVID Update

As we approach the end of term, I thought I would write and explain how currently we are planning to operate when we open again in January. I am aware that you will all have seen in the news the current rise in the COVID cases and the rapid spread of the Omicron variant, and for some this may be raising questions about the return to school in 2022.

At present schools will be re-opening for all pupils on Tuesday 4th January 2022.

What will school look like?

It is possible that we will experience high levels of COVID within our school community when we return in the New Year and as a result, the following measures will remain in place to reduce **indoor mixing** as much as possible until I have a clearer picture of how cases are transmitting locally:

- Children will be taught within their class bubbles
- Windows will be open to provide fresh air and ventilation
- New ventilation unit being installed where ventilation is poor in school
- All children will continue to enter and exit via their class external door during the day and movement around the corridors will continue to be discouraged and reduced
- Worship will take place online
- PE will take place outside (whenever possible). Please dress children appropriately for the weather on PE days (Tuesday & Friday).
- Staff are advised to wear masks in communal areas and on the playground at the end of the day
- Parents are advised to wear a mask when dropping off and picking up their children
- All visitors will wear masks when entering the school building and sanitiser their hands
- All visitors will need to complete a LFT on the morning of their visit
- Staff will complete an LFD test twice weekly: Sunday and Wednesday evening
- Any close contact staff will take a precautionary PCR
- Common touch points will continue to be cleaned more regularly

The children to play freely with other year groups at break time and lunchtime and all after school clubs will be running.

Change to the end of the day routine

Our morning drop off routine is working well with parents staggering the time they arrive. To ease the congestion at the end of the day, we would like all of the children in Otters and Hedgehogs plus their older siblings in Squirrels and Badgers to use the gate at the back of the school grounds. The children in Squirrels and Badgers who do not have any younger siblings will need to use the front entrance. This will limit the amount of children leaving via the front entrance and stop the mixing of bubbles, particularly at the end of the school day.

Lateral Flow Tests (LFT) for Children

If you are happy to do so, we would like you to test your child before they come back to school on Tuesday 4th January. Obviously, I cannot enforce testing of children under the age of 11 but if you feel happy to, we would appreciate you testing your children before their return to school. Should your LFD test show a positive result please inform the school and book a PCR test for your child.

I appreciate that Lateral Flow tests may be difficult to access at present and so therefore, we will be sending a box home for each family today.

Please can I ask that if you are taking your child for a PCR and you receive a positive result that the school are informed immediately via both of the emails below. This will enable to us to ensure the correct information is communicated to parents as soon as possible.

If your child has tested positive with a PCR test, they should not be tested using either PCR or rapid lateral flow tests for 90 days, unless they develop new symptoms during this time – in which case they should be retested immediately using PCR.

What should I do if my child has symptoms?

1. Complete a LFT test
2. If the result is positive book a PCR test to confirm
3. Inform the school – using both of the following emails – principalwarmingham@rcsat.cheshire.sch.uk and admin@warminghce.cheshire.sch.uk

What we will do if a positive PCR is confirmed:

1. Inform all parents that we have a positive COVID case with school
2. For the relevant bubble, we will ask parents to take their child for a PCR test. If any of the children come back positive, we will ask parents to complete a LFT test with their child on day one, day five and day eight. This is to ensure any asymptomatic cases in school are identified quickly.

Please note - If your child has tested positive for COVID-19, they should not be tested using either PCR or rapid lateral flow tests for 90 days, unless they develop new symptoms – in which case they should be retested immediately using PCR.

The government guidance is clear in that there is an expectation that all children should attend school unless they are:

- **symptomatic and awaiting the outcome of a PCR result**
- **positive from a LFD or PCR test**
- **a child within a household where there is a positive case (5 days self-isolation) – Cheshire East will be reviewing this early next term.**

As a result, I am unable to authorise any absences for children whose parents have made the decision to keep their children at home. This obviously leaves all head teachers in a difficult situation as we are acutely aware of parents' worries. However, we are doing everything we can in school to reduce the spread of the virus within school and will continue to work with public health and the local authority if our numbers rise again.

Remote Learning

I am also revisiting our contingency plans for Remote Learning should we need to instigate this either as a result of government directive or staffing levels.

Please can I ask that you check that you still have access to Google Classrooms and that you and your child know their username and password to access the system. We have checked these in school again with the children over the last few days but ask if you could also check these at home. Please let us know as soon as possible should you need any password support. For further information visit the school's website - [COVID-19](#)

PE and Swimming

Throughout the pandemic we have always tried to maintain a broad, balanced and inspiring curriculum for all our pupils. As we move into the Spring term this will continue to be my priority. Next term our PE lessons will be every Tuesday and Friday. Each Tuesday, the children will be working with a specialist dance teacher. Over the course of the term they will be working on several dances linked to the theme of the Lion King. They will be sharing these dances with you on Tuesday 22nd March at 6pm. On a Friday, Mr Barton our new PE teacher will be teaching the children.


There has also been an increased demand at public swimming pools for school swimming lessons as we are all faced with the prospect of 'catching up' to ensure all children can swim 25 metres before

they leave primary school. As a result, and to ensure I provide the opportunity for all to learn to swim our trust, RCSAT will be hiring a heated, covered pool over at Bunbury School in April. The children will have an intensive swimming course of the period of two weeks. Our priority will be to catch up those children at the top end of KS2 but we also hope to be able to offer some after school swimming clubs to some of our younger children. As we have now had the permanent work carried out to install this on their playground, we are looking at this becoming an annual booking. More information will follow in the New Year.


