





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Warmingham CE Primary School Our Current COVID-19 Testing and Self-isolating Procedures Updated - 16th January 2022



The table below contains details of what you need to do if you child develops symptoms, comes into close contact with someone who has tested positive or has a positive LFD test. I will update this table as necessary. The latest information will always be available on the school's website – <u>Current COVID Procedures</u>

Circumstances:	What I need to do:	Date your child can return to school:	What happens if my child's LFD test is still positive?
My child has developed COVID-19 symptoms.	Take a LFD test. Negative result – Order a PCR to confirm negative LFD test and self-isolate. Positive – Self-isolate and follow the guidance below for positive LFD tests.	Follow positive LFD test guidance below.	Follow positive LFD test guidance below.
Positive LFD test.	Your child will need to self-isolate and follow the latest <u>'Stay at Home' guidance.</u> Day of the test = Day 0 Next day = Day 1 On the morning of Day 5 and Day 6 your child will need to take a LFD test. Don't forget to register your LFD results online.	Morning of Day 6 following two negative LFD tests and does not have a temperature.	Keep taking a LFD test every morning until your child has two consecutive LFD test or until your child has completed 10 full days of self-isolation whichever is earliest.
Another member of your household has tested positive (LFD/PCR) or you have been contacted by track and trace.	Your child will need to take a LFD test each morning before coming to school for 7 days . <i>Don't forget to register your LFD results online.</i>	Your child can come into school following a negative LFD test which need to be taken every morning for 7 days.	If your child tests positive on a LFD test they will need to start their self-isolation. This counts as Day 0. They will now need to follow the guidance above for positive LFD test.

Please inform school of any positive LFD/PCR results as soon as possible:
