## **School Improvement Update:**

Over the last year, the school has moved forward at a rapid pace as we embedded the initiatives, which were introduced over the last three years – Maths No Problem, IPEELL, RWINc, Pathways to Read and Pathways to Spell. Over the next year, our focus for school development priorities are:

### **Priority 1:**

To further develop the school's vision and Christian distinctiveness through the development of spirituality and courageous advocacy within the curriculum.

### **Priority 2:**

To ensure **all** children make good to outstanding progress in **all** subjects with particular reference to:

- 1) Continue to raise expectations to ensure our more able children exceed age related expectations in all subjects.
- 2) Continue to raise expectations in writing so standards continue to rise.
- 3) Improve the children's arithmetic and rapid recall of multiplication tables (Babcock Number Sense).
- 4) Develop the parents' awareness of how we teach phonics/spelling, reading and maths, so they can support their children at home.

### **Priority 3:**

To further develop our connected curriculum with particular reference to:

- 1) Continue to raise expectations in the foundation subjects.
- 2) Review the connected curriculum to ensure it is ambitious and coherently planned and sequenced to ensure cumulative learning.
- 3) Continue to improve the provision of our music and MFL curriculum.
- 4) Forest Schools training for a member of the teaching staff.

Each term, we will update you about our on-going progress through the newsletters and at our parent council meetings.

## **Parent Council**

Each term, Mrs Appleby meets with our parent council. We would like to thank the committee for their support and time over the last year. Each autumn, we like to invite new parents onto the committee. Previous members are also welcome to run for another year, if another parent does not come forward. For the committee to run effectively, we need a parent representative from each class (one per year group if possible), a chair, vice chair and clerk. The meetings are held once a term, usually in the evening but this can be changed. The aims of the committee are:

- To work in partnership with the school to create a welcoming school which is inclusive for all parents.
- To promote partnership between the school, our pupils, the Parent Teacher Association and all parents.
- To develop and engage in activities which support the education, welfare and personal development of the pupils.
- To identify and represent the views of parents on the education provided by the school and other matters affecting the education, welfare and personal development of our pupils.
- Our parent council is a working partnership, where we celebrate our successes and work together to ensure that we provide our children with the very best opportunities so they become lifelong learners.

Dear Parents/Carers,

**RE: Energy Efficient Funding Available Cheshire East Council**

You may be aware of a new scheme known as the 'Home Upgrade Grant Scheme' (HUG) which is available in your local area. The scheme aims to improve the energy efficiency of properties which would benefit from better heating and insulation systems.

These improvements can help offset the increased energy price cap, which has led to many families suffering from the costs of higher energy bills.

You could be eligible for up to £25,000 worth of free energy efficiency products, including air source heat pumps, cavity wall insulation and/or solar panels. Qualifying homeowners will not need to contribute towards the scheme, it will be fully funded via Cheshire East Council. If you are living in a rented property, you can still take advantage of this scheme. (council/social housing not eligible).

Improveasy are working with Cheshire East Council and 'Home Upgrade Grant Scheme' to help raise awareness of the scheme and its benefits, as well as arranging and overseeing installations. Improveasy will assess your property to see what energy efficient measures are best suited, check your eligibility, apply for funding and carry out the installations of your new energy efficient upgrades.

**Here are some of the free energy efficiency measures you could be eligible for:**

- Solid wall insulation (internal or external)
- Cavity wall insulation
- Loft insulation
- Air source heat pump
- Solar PV for electricity generation

**Funding for the Home Upgrade Grant is limited to 450 homes and distributed on a first-come-first-served basis.**

To qualify, you need to be in receipt of one of the benefits below or have a total household income of less than £30,000.

- Universal Credit (UC)
- Working Tax Credit (WTC)
- Child Tax Credits (CTC)
- Income support (IS)
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income based Employment & Support Allowance (ESA)
