### A Huge Thank You from St Paul's Pantry

Thank you to everyone for all the donations of food items that were given in October, many of which were a result of the amazing Harvest collections that have been organised in the local community. A fantastic **4.4 tonnes** of food has been given which has been so gratefully received as stocks have been significantly low in the past 6 months.

***In October, Warmingham CE Primary School and St Leonard's Church collected a grand total of 140.5kg of food which has provided approximately 234 meals!***

In October the foodbank has provided crisis food parcels to **235 people from 117 households** and **2.8 tonnes** of food has been distributed.

We continue to see a steady increase of those falling into crisis so please, if you are able, do consider joining in with our **'Reverse Advent Calendar' for November 2022**. This simply means collecting a long life item of food each day from 1<sup>st</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> November. When you have collected your items, it would be very much appreciated if you could bring them to our church building to our back gate. Alternatively you can drop off at any of our local collection points (please see the poster attached for further details). Do feel free to forward this information to colleagues, friends or family who you think would like to join in this collection.

Praying with hope is not like wishful thinking, but is trusting in God who can do 'immeasurably more than we can imagine' (Ephesian 3:20).




## Prayer for the Week
