## *'Let Your Light Shine'*

*Matthew 5:16*

Dear Parents,

On Monday, the children and staff arrived in odd socks to mark the start of anti-bullying week. The children in Squirrels and Badgers' class watched a live assembly which led to some in depth conversations and debates about bullying. We finished the day with a special worship where we learnt about the focus for this years' anti-bullying campaign – if we challenge it, we can change it, and it starts by reaching out. Reach out for help if you are being bullied, reach out to friends who are being bullied and reach out by being the change you want to see. Such an important message which will make such a difference to lots of lives all over the world.

On Tuesday, our head pupils, Millie and Sophie started the National Younger Leaders programme with the Church of England. They will be working with other schools from across the country to debate questions such as 'What kind of church would you like to see?' before diving into topics such as learning to love, be the person you want to be, letting your light shine and I can do all things. After each session, they will be sharing their learning with the members of our Ethos council.

A group of our Y5 children are working with one of our governors and Mrs Allen to complete a research project about how we let our lights shine. They will be supporting the children to plan how they are going to collect the evidence to inform their findings. The children will then complete their research with Mrs Allen's support. Once the research has been completed, they will be sharing their findings with the children, staff, parents, governors, and directors.

The end of November is in sight which means Christmas is just around the corner! Next week, we will be sending out information about how parents can book tickets to watch 'Baarmy Bethlehem!' our Nativity which the children in Otters and Hedgehogs will be performing. **Free sim cards and mobile data available from Cheshire East Libraries** – If you're a Cheshire East resident and meet the eligibility criteria, you can register your interest to receive free mobile data, as well as talk minutes and text. You can also register interest on behalf of other people if you know someone who would benefit from free mobile data. Anyone aged over 18 from a low-income household who qualifies in at least one of the following ways can apply:

- you have no or insufficient access to the internet at home
- you have no or insufficient access to the internet away from home
- you can't afford your existing monthly contract or top-up

### **Energy Efficient Funding Available Cheshire East Council**

You may be aware of a new scheme known as the 'Home Upgrade Grant Scheme' (HUG) which is available in your local area. The scheme aims to improve the energy efficiency of properties which would benefit from better heating and insulation systems.

These improvements can help offset the increased energy price cap, which has led to many families suffering from the costs of higher energy bills.

You could be eligible for up to £25,000 worth of free energy efficiency products, including air source heat pumps, cavity wall insulation and/or solar panels. Qualifying homeowners will not need to contribute towards the scheme, it will be fully funded via Cheshire East Council. If you are living in a rented property, you can still take advantage of this scheme. (council/social housing not eligible).

Improveasy are working with Cheshire East Council and 'Home Upgrade Grant Scheme to help raise awareness of the scheme and its benefits, as well as arranging and overseeing installations. Improveasy will assess your property to see what energy efficient measures are best suited, check your eligibility, apply for funding and carry out the installations of your new energy efficient upgrades.

### **Here are some of the free energy efficiency measures you could be eligible for:**

- Solid wall insulation (internal or external)
- Cavity wall insulation
- Loft insulation
- Air source heat pump
- Solar PV for electricity generation

### **Funding for the Home Upgrade Grant is limited to 450 homes and distributed on a first-come-first-served basis.**

To qualify, you need to be in receipt of one of the benefits below or have a total household income of less than £30,000.

- Universal Credit (UC)
- Working Tax Credit (WTC)
- Child Tax Credits (CTC)
- Income support (IS)
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income based Employment & Support Allowance (ESA)
